Assemblyman Obernolte to Dedicate the 'Rim of the World Veterans Memorial Highway'

HESPERIA - Today, Assemblyman Jay Obernolte (R-Hesperia) announced that he will be commemorating the dedication of the 'Rim of the World Veterans Memorial Highway' on Friday, April 8, 2016 along with members of the American Legion Post 360, the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 9624, and other elected officials.

"Many local veterans have expressed their desire to have a monument honoring the sacrifices of the veterans who live in the San Bernardino Mountain communities," Assemblyman Obernolte stated. "I was proud to author Assembly Concurrent Resolution 21, which pays tribute to these veterans by designating a portion of Highway 18 as the 'Rim of the World Veterans Memorial Highway.'"

Prior to the passage of ACR 21, there were no monuments dedicated to veterans in the San Bernardino Mountains. After the dedication ceremony on April 8th there will be two located in our mountain communities: The 'Rim of the World Veterans Memorial Highway' and the veterans' monument constructed by Lake Arrowhead resident Liam Gavigan for his Eagle Scout project.
